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6. Channels for Program Transmission
6.1 General

Availability Throughout New York State, Channels for Program Transmission are not available to new customers. Existing customers may continue to keep these services and may change, make additions to and/or move, but may not renew, their services. In the wire centers and as of the effective dates listed in Section 7.1.2 of this tariff, Channels for Program Transmission are only available to existing customers as outlined in Section 7.

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Rates and charges for services explained herein are contained in Section 10.6.

6.1.1	Description
A.	Channels for program transmission are provided subject to the limitations specified in Section 3.1.1A. Channels for program transmission provide for a path for electrical transmission between two or more stations. A station is a premises designated by the subscriber at which the channel terminates or where material is transmitted or received from a program transmission channel. Channels for program transmission are provided as two-point and multipoint service configurations, and are as follows.
1.	Interexchange Channel — A channel which extends between different exchanges.
2.	Local Channel — A channel that is located within a single exchange and extends between the following locations.
a.	Stations or studios
b.	A station or studio and the point of connection with interexchange program facilities
c.	A station or a studio and a Telephone Company central office where switching equipment for interconnection of local channels is located.
B.	Facilities, specially equipped and operated for program transmission in connection with loudspeakers and sound recording, are furnished for the transmission in one direction of music or speech. Transmission in the opposite direction is provided by reversing the direction of transmission of the facilities, where practicable, or by furnishing additional facilities.
C.	Program transmission channels may be used for other communication purposes providing the frequency range, speed, and other characteristics of signals transmitted fall within those ranges currently specified for the program channels furnished.
D.	Program transmission channels, furnished for use with coin-controlled loudspeaker equipment, may be provided for one-channel or two-channel operation. With one-channel operation, the program channel may be used alternately for transmission in the opposite direction for coin-collecting and record-ordering purposes where the physical characteristics of the program channel facilities will permit such use. If the channel facilities are not suitable for transmission in the opposite direction an additional channel is required for coin-collecting and record-ordering purposes.
E.	Subscriber-provided unattended sound equipment may be connected to program transmission channels only at a studio. Program transmission channels furnished in connection with loudspeakers and sound recording may be interconnected by the subscriber only at a studio. A studio is a premises under the subscriber's control and arranged so as to prevent access by unauthorized persons, where program material originates or is received for transmission to a program transmission channel.

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
