ELECTRICITY SUPPLY PRICING OPTIONS AVAILABLE TO CUSTOMERS:

Pursuant to General Information Section 25, Pricing Options Effective January 1, 2008, customers served under this Service Classification will choose from the different electricity supply pricing options offered by the Company as described below.

Customers with metered demands of 500 kilowatts or greater during any two of the previous twelve months will be required to take service under Special Provision (i), Hourly Pricing except for the following:

- 1. customers with load supplied by NYPA beginning on or prior to December 31, 2006;
- 2. customer that received an economic incentive prior to December 31, 2006;
- 3. customers with a restriction for their Electricity Supply Pricing Option (e.g. a customer that qualified for an economic incentive prior to July 1, 2003).

Upon expiration of the customer's NYPA allocation or Economic Incentive, the customer will be required to take service under Special Provision (i), Hourly Pricing.

NYSEG will provide Delivery Service regardless of the customer's electricity supply pricing option.

1. ESCO Price Option (EPO)

This electricity supply pricing option includes fixed charges for delivery service and a fixed Transition Charge (Non-Bypassable Charge [NBC]). Commodity service will be provided by an Energy Services Company (ESCO). Customers that elect EPO and receive a Consolidated Bill will not be subject to the Bill Issuance Charge.
