GENERAL INFORMATION

22. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT RIDER FOR S.C. 2 SMALL GENERAL SERVICE, S.C. 3 LARGE GENERAL SERVICE, S.C. 5 FIRM TRANSPORTATION SERVICE, AND S.C. 8 GAS TRANSPORTATION SERVICE WITH STANDBY SALES SERVICE: (continued)

22.2.2.1 Determine Discount:

22.2.2.1.1 For an existing customer, the monthly base amount shall be the throughput for the twelve (12) monthly periods, normalized, prior to qualification for the incentive.

22.3 This Economic Development Rider is intended to provide inducement for the location or expansion of eligible customers in the Company's service area, in conjunction with and in addition to other services provided by the Company and by other agencies. Accordingly, inquiries concerning service under this provision shall be directed to the Economic Development Department, Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation, 300 Erie Boulevard West Syracuse, New York 13202. Formal application shall be made in writing upon Company's prescribed forms and a copy of this Rider, as effective at the time of such application, shall be attached thereto.

23. EMPIRE ZONE RIDER:

23.1 Any applicant for service or customer who qualifies for service under Service Classification Nos. 2, 3, 5, 7, 8 and:

23.1.1 Whose end use is non-residential in nature, and

23.1.2 Who has been certified by the state and local economic development zone administrators as being eligible to receive the benefits pursuant to Article 18-B of the General Municipal Law and

23.1.3 Who adds to the Company's system gas volume at least:

23.1.3.1 280 Therms per month for S.C. No. 2

23.1.3.2 5,000 Therms per month for S.C. No. 3

23.1.3.3 20,833 Therms per month for S.C. No. 5 or S.C. No. 8

23.1.3.4 4,167 Therms per month for S.C. No. 7

shall be eligible to take service hereunder and in accordance with Service Classification Nos. 2, 3, 5, 7, or 8 and to pay a reduced amount for such service as described below.
