Service Classification No. 12 Power for Jobs Rate (Cont'd)

- **9. Minimum Monthly Charge:** The Minimum Monthly Charge for this service classification shall consist of three components:
 - **A.** The energy, transmission and ancillary services charges rendered to the Distribution Provider by NYPA in connection with Power for Jobs service to the Retail Customer service point; and
 - **B.** The Monthly Customer Charge in 8.C, above; and
 - **C.** The applicable Minimum Monthly Demand Charge from the Parent Service Classification in 8.D. above.
- 10. Charges to the Retail Customer: In order that the benefits of the Power for Jobs allocation may flow through to the Retail Customer, the Distribution Customer may charge the Retail Customer no more for the Power for Jobs portion of its usage than the Distribution Provider charges the Distribution Customer for that portion. The Distribution Customer must clearly show on its bill to the Retail Customer the amount that the Distribution Provider is charging the Distribution Customer for the Power for Jobs portion of its usage, and the amount that the Retail Customer is being charged for that portion. Failure to adhere to this provision may result in the Distribution Customer being deemed ineligible to serve Retail Customers under this service classification.
- 11. Balancing and Settlement: The Distribution Provider will include the portion of the usage at the Retail Customer's service point that is not covered by the Power for Jobs allocation in the Distribution Customer's hourly loads that are reported to the NYISO for balancing and settlement purposes, as described in Rule 4.C. The amount included in each hour shall be the total load in the hour multiplied by (1 BDR), where BDR is the Billing Determinant Ratio calculated in Section 7.A.1, above.

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
