#### PART II - RULES AND REGULATIONS

#### 10. STREET LIGHTING

## A. STREET LIGHTING AND TRAFFIC SIGNAL SERVICE

## (1) Street Lighting - Distribution Customer or Retail Customer Owned or Leased Facilities

The Distribution Provider will provide distribution service to Distribution Customers serving Retail Customers with street lighting facilities which are owned or leased by the Retail Customer or the Distribution Customer. The Retail Customer or Distribution Customer may:

- (a) use 24 hour burning lamps; or
- (b) install controls for dusk (one-half hour after sunset) to dawn (one-half hour before sunrise) and other times of abnormal darkness, with total illumination approximating 4,200 hours per year; or
- (c) install controls for dusk (one-half hour after sunset) to 1:00 am, with total illumination approximating 2,024 hours per year; or
- (d) a combination of (a), (b), and/or (c) above.

### (2) Traffic Signals

The Distribution Provider will provide distribution service to Distribution Customers serving Retail Customers with traffic signal facilities which are owned or leased by the Retail Customer or the Distribution Customer.

#### B. RETAIL CUSTOMER ENROLLMENT

The provisions for Retail Customer enrollment set forth in sections 2.B.3 through 2.B.6 of this Tariff are not applicable to street lighting and/or traffic signal service points.

# (1) New Service Points

To initiate service for a new Retail Customer at a new street lighting or traffic signal service point, the Distribution Customer must submit a signed, written application to the Distribution Provider, containing the information specified in the Distribution Customer Manual. If multiple new service points are being initiated, the Distribution Provider and the Distribution Customer will negotiate the time frame required for enrollment, based on the number and complexity of the service points being initiated.

The Distribution Provider shall not be required to render street lighting distribution service to an area which consists of less than:

- (a) 1,500 contiguous feet, or two full, actual street blocks, whichever is less, in the case of streets, roads, alleys, ways and highways; or
- (b) the entire contiguous parcel in the case of parks and playgrounds; or
- (c) an entire contiguous school parcel in the case of school district premises,

unless such area is contiguous to other areas receiving street lighting distribution service, and such areas combined meet the foregoing minimum requirements.
