6. EXTENSION AND MAINTENANCE OF DISTRIBUTION PROVIDER FACILITIES (Cont'd)

I. EXCEPTIONAL CONDITIONS OF SUPPLY (Cont'd)

(1) (Continued)

Any unrefunded balance remaining at the end of five years from the date when the above service was first made available shall be forfeited to the Distribution Provider. In the event that service should be discontinued before the expiration of five years, the Distribution Customer shall be refunded the value of material then returnable to stock, less its removal expense, and the then remaining balance, if any, shall be forfeited to the Distribution Provider. However, in no event shall the sum total of the refunds exceed the total contribution less the applicable charges for a permanent service lateral.

- (2) If a Retail Customer is found to be the source of any disturbances, variations, or harmonics that affect the service rendered to another Retail Customer or area, the Distribution Customer whose Retail Customer is causing such disturbances, variation or harmonics shall install the necessary equipment or change operating practices to alleviate such disturbances, variations, or harmonics. If such Distribution Customer refuses or fails to install such equipment or change operating practices, then the Distribution Provider shall install the necessary equipment to alleviate the problem. The Distribution Customer whose Retail Customer is causing such disturbances, variations, or harmonics shall bear the Distribution Provider's full costs and expenses incurred in remedying the situation.

J. REPLACEMENT, RESTORATION OR DAMAGE TO FACILITIES

The Distribution Customer shall be responsible for all Distribution Provider costs and expenses when the replacement or repair of Distribution Provider facilities serving the Retail Customer is required due to the act or omission of the Distribution Customer or a Retail Customer served by the Distribution Customer.

Any relocation of a Distribution Provider facility or a portion thereof that serves the Retail Customer, requested by the Distribution Customer, or any relocation required to remedy a condition constituting a violation of law, tariff, regulation, or ordinance which has been caused by or is the responsibility of the Retail Customer, shall be preformed by the Distribution Provider at the expense of the Distribution Customer serving that Retail Customer.
