## H. POWER QUALITY (Cont'd)

## (3) <u>Correction/Remediation</u>

If the customer causes or contributes to a power quality condition that adversely affects the Company's system or other customers, the Company shall notify the customer of such condition. The customer shall be responsible for correcting that condition in a manner deemed adequate by the Company, by:

- (a) Installing and maintaining at its own expense, corrective equipment on its facilities to remedy the condition; or
- (b) Paying the costs and expenses for installation of corrective equipment by the Company, on its side of the point of delivery, to effect such correction.

## I. ON-SITE GENERATORS, SPECIAL CONTRACTS

Any subtransmission level customer who has an on-site generator and is willing to meet operating conditions similar to those set forth in any existing Company contract for sales to such a customer may elect to take supplementary service at rates provided under an existing contract. The operating conditions, such as minimum contract demand and minimum energy consumption, shall be developed for each applicant in a nondiscriminatory manner consistent with operating conditions applicable in any existing contract. Customers taking service at lower voltages who elect to take supplementary service and are willing to meet operating conditions similar to those set forth in any existing contract may elect to take such service at rates provided under such contract, but in this case, increased to retain the same energy and demand voltage level differentials as full service customers in the class where service would otherwise be taken.

Anytime a customer elects to enter into a negotiated contract (agreement) pursuant to the provisions of the Company's rate schedules, the Company will duly file an addendum to its Rate Schedule to summarize the essential provisions of such contract/agreement.
