2.7 CURTAILABLE ELECTRIC SERVICE

Any customer, or group of customers who form a cooperative, taking service under this Service Classification may elect to designate a portion of his load as curtailable and receive a billing credit, subject to the terms defined below. Customers selecting this Special Provision must provide access to a dedicated telephone line at the meter location. The customer's metering will be changed to permit billing under this Special Provision at the earliest convenience of the Company. The customer shall pay the higher customer charge shown in d) below rather than the customer charge which would normally apply under this Service Classification.

- a) The customer must be able to reduce his electric demand by at least 100 Kw. in the Summer Peak Season, the Winter Peak Season or both within either a 2 hour or 24 hour notification period. The customer shall agree, in writing, to limit his electric demand to a specified Firm Power Level during curtailment periods. For each Peak Season, a different Firm Power Level may be specified no later than six months prior to the beginning of the Peak Season. This provision shall be waived for any customer who is not taking service under this Special Provision six months prior to the beginning of the peak season. The Firm Power Level shall be agreed upon by both the customer and the Company. For any curtailment period during which the customer is unable to reduce his electric load for any part of the curtailment period to a level at or below the Firm Power Level, the customer shall be subject to additional charges as defined below.
- b) Service under this Special Provision shall be subject to curtailment between the hours of 8 AM and 10 PM on weekdays during the Peak Periods of the Summer and Winter Peak Seasons described below.
- c) Curtailment periods shall be limited to a maximum of 10 occurrences per calendar year and not more than 10 hours per occurrence. Curtailments will be limited to no more than three consecutive weekdays and no more than six days in any Peak Period.
