SERVICE CLASSIFICATION NO. 14 (Cont'd)

STANDBY SERVICE (Cont'd)

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

The numbering of the paragraphs hereunder begins with the above service classification number.

14.1 If the Customer has connected generation to its electric system without notification to the Company, the Company may disconnect the Customer and shall backbill the Customer for all service rendered subsequent to installation of such generation at the rates and charges set forth in this Service Classification including the applicable interest. Backbills will be based on the generator's nameplate rating and a 100% usage factor. The backbill period will be for the period from the time the generator was brought on line to the time the installation became known.

14.2 Customers supplied by generators with nameplate ratings of 1000 kW and greater must provide the Company with their schedule of planned maintenance and outage. The schedule must be provided upon taking service and annually thereafter.

14.3 If the measured demand exceeds the current Contract Demand by ten percent or more, a surcharge equal to twelve times the demand in excess over the Contract Demand will apply to that monthly bill. If the measured demand exceeds the current Contract Demand by more than ten percent, a surcharge equal to twenty-four times the demand in excess over the Contract Demand will apply to that bill. If either event occurs, the monthly Contract Demand will be adjusted to the increased Contract Demand.

14.5 The Company shall have the option to negotiate a contract for Standby Service with Customers that have a viable competitive alternative. A competitive alternative for this purpose may be defined as a means of meeting electric power needs without making use of the Company's distribution system, including electric isolation for the Company's electric system or relocation outside the Company's control area. The Company is not required to accept a Customer's request for an individually negotiated contract.
