## Purpose of Filing

The Companies are submitting tariff revisions in compliance with the Order to establish residential tariffs for eligible electric vehicle charging.

#### Overview

A customer with an eligible electric vehicle may opt to take service under a Special Provision within the residential Day-Night Service Classifications for each Company<sup>1</sup> for as long as the customer owns or operates the electric vehicle, regardless of the amount of electricity the customer uses.

The Special Provision establishes time-differentiated delivery rates, consistent with the day-night periods established for the Service Classification. A customer that qualifies for the Special Provision will pay the same Customer Charge as a customer that takes service under Service Classification No. 1 for each Company. A customer that selects the Special Provision will have the option to take all of their service through one meter that will record total usage at their premise, or the customer could elect to take service under a separate account using the residential TOU rates under the Special Provision for the sole purpose of charging an electric vehicle. Such customers will be responsible for the costs to install the additional meter, will be subject to an additional customer charge and will not be eligible for the Price Guarantee as described below.

Customers that choose the Special Provision for their total load will have the benefit of a one-year Price Guarantee. Under this Price Guarantee, the customer will receive a credit for the difference, if any, between what the customer paid under the Special Provision TOU rate and what the customer would have been billed under the customer's previous residential Service Classification. The customer will receive the credit on their bill after the twelfth month. The Price Guarantee will be made on a total bill basis for customers that take supply service with the Companies, and on a delivery-only basis for retail access customers. If a customer terminates service under the Special Provision prior to the end of 12 months, the customer will not be eligible for the Price Guarantee. Any credits paid to customers pursuant to the Price Guarantee will be recovered through the Transition Charge.

# Newspaper Publication

Ordering Clause No. 5 of the Order directs the Companies to complete newspaper publication in accordance with Public Service Law 66(12)(b) and 16 NYCRR 720-8.1, however, on December 7, 2018, the Joint Utilities<sup>2</sup> submitted a <u>Petition of the Joint Utilities for a Limited Waiver Regarding Newspaper Publication</u>, requesting a waiver from the newspaper publication requirements.
