**RE: Case 18-E-0206, Tariff filings to Effectuate the Provisions of Public  
Service Law Section 66-o (Residential Electric Vehicle Tariff)**

Dear Secretary Burgess:

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (“Con Edison” or the “Company”) is filing with the Public Service Commission (the “Commission”) amendments to its Schedule for Electricity Service, P.S.C. No. 10 – Electricity (the “Electric Tariff”), applicable to its customers in the City of New York and the County of Westchester.

The revised Electric Tariff Leaves, which are identified below, are filed to become effective on April 1, 2019:

**Reason for Filing**

This filing is being made pursuant to the Commission’s *Order Rejecting Tariff Filings and Directing Tariff Revisions* issued and effective November 15, 2018 in Case 18-E-0206 (the “Order”). The Order was issued to implement the provisions of Public Service Law Section 66-o (Residential Electric Vehicle Charging Tariff). The Order required the Company to file tariff revisions for residential customers with registered plug in electric vehicles (“PEVs”) that take service under residential time-of-use (“TOU”) rates such that the customer charge will be equal to the traditional non-TOU residential customer charge.

### **Tariff Changes**

Pursuant to the Order, the Company is filing changes to Rates II and III and Special Provision F of Service Classification (“SC”) 1 to its Electric Tariff. The changes to SC1 Rate II and Rate III reflect the change to the customer charge for customers who annually register PEVs with the Company. Special Provision F of SC1 was updated to clarify that customers must register their PEVs annually to be eligible for separately metered service for the sole purpose of PEV charging.

### **Conclusion and Notice**

As directed by Ordering Clause 4 of the Order, the Company is filing changes to the Electric Tariff to become effective April 1, 2019. Although Ordering Clause 5 of the Order directs newspaper publication, Con Edison joined other utilities in a petition requesting a waiver of this requirement.<sup>1</sup> The Company will comply with the Commission determination associated with the waiver request.
