Dear Secretary Burgess,

New York State Electric & Gas Corporation ("NYSEG") and Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation ("RG&E") (together the "Companies") hereby transmit for filing the enclosed tariff leaves in compliance with the New York State Public Service Commission's ("Commission") <u>Order Authorizing the Clean Energy Fund Framework</u>, issued and effective January 21, 2016 (the "CEF Order"), and <u>Order Authorizing Utility-Administered Energy Efficiency Portfolio Budgets and Targets for 2016 – 2018</u>, issued and effective January 22, 2016 (the "EE Order"), in the above referenced proceedings. These tariff leaves are transmitted for filing in compliance as identified herein and in accordance with the requirements of Appendix 7-H (electronic tariff filing system) to the Commission's Codes, Rules and Regulations (16 NYCRR Appendix 7-H). The statements are to become effective on January 1, 2019.

In compliance with the EE Order, the Companies developed the following surcharges:

NYSEG Electric EE Tracker:

Rates were designed to include the authorized collections of \$17,035,451 and the 2018 forecasted over-collection of \$46,060. Interest was accrued on the 2018 prior period amount. The collection amount was reduced by the interest on unspent funds. The collections were divided by the forecasted units for 2019 to calculate the surcharge as \$0.001159 per kWh.

NYSEG Gas EE Tracker:

Rates were designed to include the authorized collections of \$2,038,215 and the 2018 forecasted over-collection of \$105,324. Interest was accrued on the 2018 prior period amount. The collection amount was reduced by the interest on unspent funds. The collections were divided by the forecasted therms for 2019 to calculate the surcharge as \$0.003543 per therm.

RGE Electric EE Tracker:

Rates were designed to include the authorized collections of \$10,482,078 and the 2018 forecasted over-collection of \$109,913. Interest was accrued on the 2018 prior period amount. The collection amount was reduced by the interest on unspent funds. The collections were divided by the forecasted units for 2019 to calculate the surcharge as \$0.001442 per kWh.

RGE Gas EE Tracker:

Rates were designed to include the authorized collections of \$2,720,749 and the 2018 forecasted over-collection of \$202,677.56. Interest was accrued on the 2018 prior period amount. The collection amount was reduced by the interest on unspent funds. The collections were divided by the forecasted therms for 2019 to calculate the surcharge as \$0.004238 per therm.

In compliance with the CEF Order, the Companies developed the following surcharges:

NYSEG Electric CEF Surcharge:

Rates were designed to include the authorized collections of \$68,712,875, an

uncollectible adder of \$178,204 on the incremental ordered collections¹, and the 2018 forecasted over-collection of \$1,129,806. Interest was applied on the 2018 prior period amount. The collections were divided by the forecasted units for 2019 to calculate the surcharge as \$0.004773 per kWh.

NYSEG Gas NYSERDA EE Surcharge:

Rates were designed to include the authorized collections of \$1,034,545, an uncollectible adder of (\$20,834) on the incremental ordered collections, and the 2018 forecasted over-collection of \$244,165. Interest was applied on the 2018 prior period amount. The collections were divided by the forecasted therms for 2019 to calculate the surcharge as \$0.001445 per therm.

RGE Electric CEF Surcharge:

Rates were designed to include the authorized collections of \$37,364,397, an uncollectible adder of \$150,104 on the incremental ordered collections, and the 2018 forecasted over-collection of \$1,009,538. Interest was applied on the 2018 prior period amount. The collections were divided by the forecasted units for 2019 to calculate the surcharge as \$0.005274 per kWh.

RGE Gas NYSERDA EE Surcharge:

Rates were designed to include the authorized collections of \$992,118, an uncollectible adder of (\$36,925) on the incremental ordered collections, and the 2018 forecasted over-collection of \$243,066. Interest was applied on the 2018 prior period amount. The collections were divided by the forecasted therms for 2019 to calculate the surcharge as \$0.001220 per therm.

Newspaper Publication

In accordance with Ordering Clause 49 of the CEF Order and Ordering Clause 8 of the EE Order, the requirements of 66(12)(b) of the Public Service Law requiring newspaper publication has been waived.
