Dear Secretary Phillips:

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (the “Company”) is filing with the Public Service Commission (the “Commission”) amendments to its Schedule for Electricity Service, P.S.C. No. 10 – Electricity (the “Electric Tariff”), applicable to its customers in the City of New York and the County of Westchester.

The revised Electric Tariff Leaves, which are identified below, are filed to become effective on April 6, 2020.

Reason for Filing

On January 29, 2020, the Company submitted the Rate Year (“RY”) 1 changes in compliance with the Commission’s Order Adopting Terms of Joint Proposal and Establishing Electric and Gas Rate Plan, issued and effective January 16, 2020, in Cases 19-E-0065 and 19-G-0066 (the “Order”).

Since making the January 29, 2020 filing, the Company has discovered a few minor errors from the RY 1 filing that it is correcting in this filing.

Tariff Changes

The Company is making the following changes to the Electric Tariff as described below:

- The revision to Leaf 389.1 corrects the rate class reference from Rate II to Rate III for which there is a reduced customer charge when the customer annually registers their plug-in electric vehicle with the Company.
- The revision to Leaf 389.3 is for formatting only. Specifically, the paragraph under Billable Demand was revised for alignment with other paragraphs and spacing with the following paragraph.
- The revision to Leaf 496 corrects the absence of the unit of measure, per kW, applicable to one rate that was inadvertently deleted.

Conclusion and Notice

Consistent with Ordering Clause 3 of the Order, the Company is filing its tariff amendments to take effect on a temporary basis, on not less than three days' notice, to become effective on April 6, 2020.

Since these changes are of a housekeeping nature and no customers are impacted by these changes, the Company requests waiver of the newspaper publication requirements.
