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Purpose of Filing

The Companies are submitting proposed tariff revisions to be in compliance with the changes to New York State Public Service Law ("New York State PSL"), Section, 66-p.

Overview

Changes to New York State PSL that will become effective on April 18, 2020, provide for prospective tenants or lessees the ability to request charges incurred at a residential premises prior to the commencement of tenancy or execution of a lease.

Billing Information for Residential Rental Premises which states that every gas and electric corporation shall make available to any landlord or lessor of residential rental premises, within ten days of receipt of a written request from any prospective tenant or lessee, prior to the commencement of tenancy or execution of a lease, information consisting of the charges incurred at such premises for gas or electric service or both for the life of the dwelling unit or the preceding two year period, whichever is shorter. Such information shall be identified solely by the address of the dwelling unit, and no other information identifying the owner, lessee, or other occupant of the dwelling unit shall be provided¹. Such information shall be furnished without imposition of any charge or fee.

Newspaper Publication

The Companies request that the requirement of § 66(12)(b) of the Public Service Law and 16 NYCRR §720-8.1 as to newspaper publication be waived. When a prospective customer contacts the Companies regarding electric or natural gas service, they can request the charges for a property they are interested in.
