Dear Secretary Burgess:

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (“Con Edison” or the “Company”) is filing with the Public Service Commission (“Commission”) amendments to its Schedule for Electricity Service, P.S.C. No. 10 – Electricity (“Tariff”), applicable to its customers in the City of New York and the County of Westchester. The Tariff leaves, which are identified below, are filed to become effective on May 1, 2015:

Background and Reason for Filing

On January 16, 2015, the Company made a filing pursuant to the Commission’s Order on Proposed Tariff Amendments, issued and effective January 9, 2015, in Case 13-E-0573, describing the specific methodology that will be used to determine the savings from a completed energy efficiency project and the process that participants must follow to request a pledge reduction. The Commission’s Order Approving Tariff Amendments with Modifications, issued and effective April 20, 2015, approved the tariff amendments to become effective on May 1, 2015, provided that, for the 2015 Capability period only, the Company (a) permit requests to be made by June 1, 2015, to be applicable commencing with the first month of participation during the 2015 Capability Period, and (b) specify that the project completion date shall occur after the enrollment deadline for the 2014 Capability Period and before June 1, 2015.

Tariff Changes

The Company is filing changes to Tariff Leaf 266.1 and Leaf 291.1, for Riders S and U, respectively, to make the above changes.

Conclusion and Notice

Pursuant to Ordering Clause 1, the tariff amendments are filed on not less than one day's notice to become effective on May 1, 2015. Pursuant to Ordering Clause 2, the requirement for newspaper publication of these changes is waived.
