The enclosed tariff leaves, issued by New York State Electric & Gas Corporation and Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation (together the “Companies”) are transmitted for filing in compliance with the requirements of the New York Public Service Commission’s (the "Commission") Order Raising Net Metering Minimum Caps, Requiring Tariff Revisions, Making Other Findings, and Establishing Further Procedures, issued and effective on December 15, 2014 (the “Order”), in the above referenced proceedings¹. The leaves will become effective on May 4, 2015.

The Companies are filing tariff amendments in compliance with Ordering Clause No. 1 of the Order to increase the net metering minimum purchase caps to 6% of their 2005 load. The limits are applicable to solar photovoltaic (PV), farm waste, micro-hydroelectric, micro-combined heat and power, and fuel cell technologies.

Requirements of Public Service Law Section 66 (12) (b) as to newspaper publication of the tariff revisions are waived pursuant to the Ordering Clause No. 3.
