RE: Case 13-E-0043, Rider J – Business Incentive Rate

Dear Acting Secretary Cohen:

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. ("Con Edison" or the "Company") is filing with the Public Service Commission (the "Commission") a change to its Schedule for Electricity Service, P.S.C. No. 10 – Electricity (the "Tariff"), applicable to its customers in the City of New York and the County of Westchester.

The revised Tariff Leaf, which is identified below, has an effective date of May 20, 2013:

Reason for Filing

On February 1, 2013, the Company made a tariff filing with the Commission proposing to remove the 25-percent residential-use ceiling on Leaf 205 of Rider J – Business Incentive Rate ("BIR") in cases where a customer receives high-tension service and applies for BIR as a Biomedical Research Customer. The Company also proposed housekeeping changes to correct the numbering on Leaf 198 and Leaf 203.

The Commission, in its Order, issued and effective May 16, 2013, in Case 13-E-0043 approved the filing with modifications. The Commission ordered the Company to expand its revision of Rider J related to the residential-use ceiling to include Business Incubator Customers who take high tension service. The Commission also ordered the Company to add tariff language to ensure that the BIR allocation applies only to the Biomedical Research or Business Incubator load and not to the residential load on the premises.

Tariff Changes

As directed by the Order, the Company has amended Leaf 205 to indicate that the 25-percent residential-use ceiling does not apply to high-tension customers who apply for BIR as a Biomedical Research Customer, Business Incubator or Business Incubator Graduate provided that the Rider J allocation is not be applied to the residential load on the premises.

Conclusion and Notice

As directed by Ordering Clause 1 of the Order, this filing is being made to become effective on not less than one day's notice on May 20, 2013. As directed by Ordering Clause 2 of the Order, the Commission has waived newspaper publication of these changes.
