Re: Clean Energy Standard – Tariff Filing

Dear Secretary Burgess,

Enclosed herewith are the following materials, issued and transmitted for filing on behalf of the Village of Freeport, New York, in accordance with the requirements of the Public Service Commission (“Commission”).

1. New tariff leaf for P.S.C. No. 9, Electricity, containing provisions for adding the costs of the annual renewable energy obligations (RECs) and nuclear energy requirements (purchase of ZECs), pursuant to New York State’s Clean Energy Standard, outlined in tariff Section XIII, Adjustment of Rates and Charges:

2. Revised tariff leaf for P.S.C. No. 9, Electricity, containing revisions to the Table of Contents and Service Classification Nos. 1, 2 and 3.

These revisions are issued as of December 9, 2016, and are proposed to be effective March 1, 2017.

First in Value First in Service

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The above proposed revisions are being made pursuant to the Commission's August 1, 2016 order in the Clean Energy Standard proceeding to increase the share of renewable energy consumption in New York to 50% by 2030 and to help preserve zero-emission nuclear energy in the State. In the August 1 order, the Commission directed all load serving entities in New York State to meet the obligations to invest in both renewable energy (through the procurement of Renewable Energy Credits) and nuclear energy (through the purchase of Zero Energy Credits). The Commission authorized LSEs to recover the costs of RECs and ZECs by incorporating the costs into the commodity charge on customers' bills. The proposed tariff revision aims to recover the REC and ZEC charges as outlined under Section XIII of the Village of Freeport's tariff, Adjustment of Rates and Charges.

The Village respectfully requests a waiver from the newspaper publication requirements of PSL §66(12) (b) of the New York State Public Service Commission's Rules and Regulations.

Accordingly, we respectfully request that the Public Service Commission expedite approval of the requested revisions. Additionally, we request that the Public Service Commission please advise the undersigned of any action undertaken in this proceeding and also notify Jeffrey C.
