Re: Case 14-E-0488 - In the Matter of the Continuation of Standby Rate Exemptions.

Dear Secretary Burgess:

New York State Electric & Gas Corporation ("NYSEG") and Rochester Gas & Electric Corporation ("RG&E") (the Companies"), hereby transmit for filing the enclosed tariff leaves in compliance with the New York State Public Service Commission's ("NYPSC" or "Commission") Order Denying Rehearing and Making Other Findings, issued and effective November 25, 2015 ("the November Order"), ¹ and the Order Continuing and Expanding the Standby Rate Exemption issued and effective April 20, 2015 ("the April Order"), in the above referenced proceeding. These tariff leaves are transmitted for filing in compliance as identified herein and in accordance with the requirements of Appendix 7-H (electronic tariff filing system) to the Commission's Codes, Rules and Regulations (16 NYCRR Appendix 7-H).

Below is a list of the revised tariff leaves to become effective December 5, 2015:

NYSEG – PSC No. 120 Leaf No. 285 – Revision 4

RG&E – PSC No. 19 Leaf No. 240 – Revision 7

¹ The Secretary issued a <u>Notice Extending Time to File</u>, on May 29, 2015, that permitted the utilities to file tariff revisions ten days after the Commission's resolution of the petitions filed in this proceeding.





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Purpose of the Filing

The Companies are filing tariff amendments in compliance with Ordering Clause 1 of the April Order and Ordering Clause 2 of the November Order to allow a customer that installs a combined heat and power facility sized up to 15 MW be exempt from standby rates. Additionally, in accordance with the November Order, the Companies will require any customer who installs a combined heat and power facility sized between 1 MW and up to 15 MW to install revenue grade, interval meters and telemetry equipment.

Newspaper Publication

In accordance with Ordering Clause 2 of the April Order, the requirements of 66(12)(b) of the Public Service Law requiring newspaper publication has been waived.
