RE: Case 15-E-0407, Net Metering

Dear Secretary Burgess:

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (“Con Edison” or the “Company”) is filing with the Public Service Commission (the “Commission”) an amendment to its Schedule for Electricity Service, P.S.C. No. 10 – Electricity (the “Tariff”), applicable to its customers in the City of New York and the County of Westchester.

The revised Tariff Leaf, which is identified below, makes a change to Rider R – Net Metering for Customer-Generators. The Tariff Leaf has an effective date of November 6, 2015:

Tariff Change

The Commission’s Order Establishing Interim Ceilings on the Interconnection of Net Metered Generation (the “Order”), issued and effective October 16, 2015, in Case 15-E-0407, directed the utilities to file tariff changes to waive the net metering purchase caps on an interim basis.¹ As a result, the Company is filing a change to Rider R to

indicate the following: “The limit of total rated generating capacity of electric generating equipment served under this Rider (33,246 kW for wind electric generating equipment and 664,920 kW for the total of all other electric generating equipment) is waived to the extent directed by the Commission in its Order issued October 16, 2015, in Case 15-E-0407.”

Conclusion and Notice

Ordering Clause 1 of the Order directed utilities to file tariff changes by October 30, 2015, to become effective on November 6, 2015. As specified in Ordering Clause 2 of the Order, the requirement for newspaper publication was waived.
