The enclosed tariff leaves, issued by New York State Electric & Gas Corporation ("NYSEG") and Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation ("RG&E") (together the "Companies"), are transmitted for filing in compliance with the requirements of Appendix 7-H (electronic tariff filing system) to the New York State Public Service Commission's ("Commission") Codes, Rules and Regulations (16 NYCRR Appendix 7-H). 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Purpose of Filing

The Companies are filing revisions to their respective electric and gas tariffs to implement certain changes necessary for the Companies to adhere to the requirements of the Order Modifying Community Choice Aggregation Programs and Establishing Further Process issued under Case No. 14-M-0224 on January 19, 2023.

The changes include:

1. Removing the privacy screen for Community Choice Aggregation (“CCA”) aggregated customer data provided by the CCA Administrator or the Companies, as well as including customer meter read cycle information in such aggregated data;
2. Adding additional customer-specific data to the information that the Companies shall provide to the CCA Administrator after the CCA contract has been executed between the municipality and the ESCO; and
3. Adding in a reference to the dispute resolution process specified in the Order.

Publication

The Companies respectfully request the requirements of Section 66(12)(b) of the Public Service Law and 16 NYCRR Section 720-8.1 regarding newspaper publication be waived as the changes do not affect customer bills and will be communicated to the CCA administrators directly.
