Dear Secretary Phillips:

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (the “Company”) is filing with the Public Service Commission (the “Commission”) amendments to its Schedule for Electricity Service, P.S.C. No. 10 – Electricity (the “Electric Tariff”), applicable to its customers in the City of New York and the County of Westchester.

The revised Electric Tariff Leaves, which are identified below, are filed to become effective on May 1, 2023.

Reason for Filing

This filing is made pursuant to the Commission’s *Order Directing Dynamic Load Management Program Changes*, in Case 14-E-0423 issued April 21, 2023 (the “Order”).

Tariff Changes

Pursuant to the Order, the Company made the following tariff amendments:

- 1) Clarified that Dynamic Load Relief Program Events can begin at any time after 6:00 PM, ending by midnight; and
- 2) Enabled customers to respond to Commercial System Relief Program (“CSRP”) events for a minimum of four consecutive hours during the six-hour Response Window, which includes the Contracted Hours and the hour preceding and the hour following the Contracted Hours in Networks with extended peaks as listed on the Company’s website. (The Company notes that the language on Leaf 272 was modified from the draft version in Appendix B of the Company’s December 8, 2022 petition to clarify that participants are only required to provide Load Relief for four consecutive hours within the Response Window).

Conclusion and Notice

Pursuant to Ordering Clause 3 of the Order, the Company is filing these changes to become effective on May 1, 2023, on not less than five days’ notice. Pursuant to Ordering Clause 5 of the Order, the Commission waived the requirement for newspaper publication of these changes.
