**RE: Case 15-E-0751, In the Matter of the Value of Distributed Energy Resources**

Dear Secretary Phillips:

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (the “Company”) is filing with the Public Service Commission (the “Commission”) amendments to its Schedule for Electricity Service, P.S.C. No. 10 – Electricity (the “Electric Tariff”), applicable to its customers in the City of New York and the County of Westchester.

The revised Electric Tariff Leaf, which is identified below, is filed to become effective on May 1, 2023.

**Reason for Filing**

This filing is made pursuant to the Commission’s *Order Directing Tariff Modifications*, issued April 21, 2023, in Case 15-E-0751 (the “Order”). The Order directed the Company to file tariff amendments to sunset the Community Credit Tranche on May 1, 2023, unless it is otherwise exhausted before then, and that it be permanently replaced by the Community Adder.

**Tariff Changes**

Pursuant to the Order, the Company has modified the Community Credit Component under Rider R – Net Metering and Value Stack Tariff for Customer-Generators to state that

projects that have not received the Community Credit MW allocations as of May 1, 2023, will no longer be eligible for the Community Credit.<sup>1</sup>

### **Conclusion and Notice**

Pursuant to Ordering Clause 1 of the Order, the Company is filing these changes to become effective on May 1, 2023, on not less than five days' notice. Pursuant to Ordering Clause 3 of the Order, the Commission waived the requirement for newspaper publication of these changes.

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<sup>1</sup> As per the Order, CDG projects eligible on May 1, 2023 and after will receive the Community Adder in place of the Community Credit directly from the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority ("NYSERDA"). Since NYSERDA is administering these incentives, the Company did not add this into its Electric Tariff.
