RE: Case 20-E-0197, Cost Recovery for the Brooklyn Clean Energy Hub

Dear Secretary Phillips:

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (the “Company”) is filing with the Public Service Commission (the “Commission”) amendments to its Schedule for Electricity Service, P.S.C. No. 10 – Electricity (the “Electric Tariff”), applicable to its customers in the City of New York and the County of Westchester. The Company is also filing amendments to its Schedule for PASNY Delivery Service, P.S.C. No. 12 – Electricity (the “PASNY Tariff”),¹ applicable to delivery by the Company of power and associated energy to Authority Public Customers under the PASNY Tariff.

The revised Electric Tariff and PASNY Tariff Leaves, which are identified below, are filed to become effective on July 1, 2023.

Reason for Filing

This filing is made pursuant to the Commission’s *Order Approving Cost Recovery for Clean Energy Hub*, in Case 20-E-0197 issued April 20, 2023 (the “Order”). The Order directed

the Company to file tariff revisions necessary to effectuate cost recovery for the Brooklyn Clean Energy Hub.

Tariff Changes

Pursuant to the Order, the Company added components in the Monthly Adjustment Clause of the Electric Tariff (“MAC”) and Other Charges and Adjustments in the PASNY Tariff (“OTH”) to recover carrying charges related to the Brooklyn Clean Energy Hub after it has been placed into service and until such costs are reflected in base rates. The carrying charge is capped based on a project cost of \$810 million, subject to review for recovery of additional costs as specified in the Order. The amount to be recovered under the PASNY Tariff will be based on the PASNY Allocation.

Conclusion and Notice

Pursuant to Ordering Clause 4 of the Order, the Company is filing these changes within 30 days of the issuance of the Order. Pursuant to Ordering Clause 5 of the Order, the Commission waived the requirement for newspaper publication of these changes.
