The CBC Charge recovers the costs associated with certain public benefit programs (*i.e.*, low income program, energy efficiency programs, and the clean energy programs) from non-demand billed customers installing NEM eligible on-site generation projects on or after January 1, 2022. The CBC Charge cannot be offset by credits for the customer's excess generation.
