In compliance with Ordering Clause No. 11 of the Public Service Commission's Order Authorizing Phase 1 Arrears Reduction Program in the above referenced proceedings, issued and effective June 16, 2022 (the "Order"), New York State Electric & Gas Corporation ("NYSEG") and Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation ("RG&E"), (together the "Companies"), hereby file the following tariff leaves to become effective, on a temporary basis, July 1, 2022.

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Purpose of Filing

The Companies are filing amendments to its tariffs in compliance with Ordering Clause No. 11 of the Order to implement the Arrears Relief Program.

A low-income customer that had arrears as of May 1, 2022 may be eligible for a one-time bill credit. Additionally, the Companies are implementing a surcharge. The surcharge is designed to recover the program costs related to the arrears management plan and associated carrying charges, as discussed in the body of the Order. NYSEG plans to assess the surcharge for 3 years, and RG&E plans to assess the surcharge for 5 years to minimize ratepayer impacts.

Newspaper Publication

In accordance with Ordering Clause No. 12, the requirements of Public Service Law §66(12)(b) and 16 NYCRR §720-8.1 to be completed prior to the effective date are waived. The Companies will complete newspaper publication and provide proof of notice has been published for four successive weeks.
