**RE: Case 22-M-0159, Proceeding to Implement Customer Credits and
Reimbursements Pursuant to Public Service Law Section 73**

Dear Secretary Phillips:

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (the “Company”) is filing with the Public Service Commission (the “Commission”) amendments to its Schedule for Electricity Service, P.S.C. No. 10 – Electricity (the “Electric Tariff”), applicable to its customers in the City of New York and the County of Westchester. The revised Electric Tariff Leaves, which are identified below, are filed to become effective on July 25, 2022.

Reason for Filing

This filing is made pursuant to the Commission’s Order Implementing Public Service Law Section 73, issued and effective July 14, 2022, in Case 22-M-0159 (the “Order”). The Order directed the Company to file tariff amendments in conformance with the Order to compensate residential and small business customers who experience widespread prolonged outages pursuant to Public Service Law Section 73.

Tariff Changes

Pursuant to the Order, the Company is making the following changes to the Electric Tariff:

- The Company added General Rule 12.6 to the Electric Tariff to include provisions from the Order related to compensation to customers who experience widespread prolonged outages.
- The Company modified the existing sections of the Electric Tariff providing for credits to customers who experience prolonged outages (General Rule 12.5) and providing reimbursement for customers for spoiled food and medicine after certain outage events (General Rule 21.1). Consistent with the Order, the modifications specify that when customers are eligible to receive compensation under General Rule 12.6, they will not be eligible to also receive compensation under General Rules 12.5 and 21.1.

Conclusion and Notice

As directed by Ordering Clause 2 of the Order, the tariff amendments are filed on not less than three days' notice to become effective on July 25, 2022. The Company requests that the requirements of Section 66(12)(b) of the Public Service Law and 16 NYCRR Section 720-8 as to newspaper publication be waived, as the Company will publish this information on its website.
