Summary of Tariff Changes

In compliance with the above referenced Order and as described in the Company's letter dated July 27, 2001, the Company has made the following changes to General Information Section VIII "Increase in Rates Applicable in Municipality Where Service Is Supplied":

E A new provision has been added to provide for the recovery of the new State Income Tax expense imposed on the Company under New York State Tax Law Section 209. .

- E The paragraph entitled "Statement of Percentage Increase in Rates and Charges" has been modified to provide for appropriate tax recovery under Section 186-a, 186-c, 209 and 209-b. It also provides for the application of separate percentage increases for residential and non-residential services.
- E The "Statement of Percentage Increase in Rates and Charges" has been revised to reflect the changes described above. In addition, the Statement also shows percentage increases to be applied to various other charges other than rates, rate adjustments, late payment charges and security deposits.
