Dear Commissioners:

The enclosed Statements, which are listed below, are issued by Central Hudson Gas & Electric Corporation to become effective on May 12, 2008, the billing date for the eighth batch of the Company's May 2008 billing cycle, and are transmitted for filing in compliance with the requirements of the Public Service Commission of the State of New York regarding changes in adjustments.

PSC No. 15 Electricity

Statement of Market Price Charge and Market Price Adjustment	MPC - 83
Statement of Miscellaneous Charges	MISC - 83
Statement of Purchased Power Adjustment	PPA - 82

The factors included in MPC Statement No. 83 are applicable to energy supplied by the Company and are based on the actual commodity costs required to serve the Company's full service customers during the month of April. MPC Statement No. 83 includes Market Price Adjustment (MPA) factors corresponding to the reconciliation of energy costs for the month of January 2008 which were collected through the MPC and for which collections were completed in April. Due to the significant under collection resulting from the estimate of full service and retail access sales, and to mitigate bill impacts, one third of the under collection is included with the current MPA factors with the remaining two thirds to be included with factors effective June and July.

The factors included in MISC Statement No. 83 are applicable to all energy delivered by the Company and are intended to refund to or collect from customers the net benefit or cost of non-avoidable, variable energy related revenues and costs associated with the Company's remaining generation facilities and from mandatory purchases from Independent Power Producers for the month of April. MISC-83 also includes a reconciliation component for January 2008 costs/benefits.

The factors included in PPA Statement No. 82 are applicable to all energy delivered by the Company and are intended to refund to or collect from customers the benefit or cost, respectively, of the Company's Purchase Power Agreement with the new owners of the nuclear generating plant previously owned by the Company. PPA-82 also includes a reconciliation component for January 2008 costs/benefits.
