Description of the Proposed Revisions

On November 25, 2009, RG&E filed revisions to its tariff in compliance with the amendment to PSL Section 66-j to implement net metering for qualifying Residential micro-combined heat and power or fuel cell generating systems.

After review by and discussions with Staff, the Company is filing further revisions to provide residential customers with the opportunity to lease a Micro-combined Heat and Power ("MCHP") generating system and be eligible for net metering.

Furthermore, the revisions clarify that when the output from the customer's MCHP or fuel cell generating system exceeds the amount of electricity supplied by

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RG&E, credits will be calculated based on the Company's avoided cost using Service Classification No. 5 energy rate. The Company is also removing reference to an annual reconciliation as PSL Section 66-j does not provide for an annual reconciliation for customers participating in net metering with MCHP or fuel cell technologies.

Newspaper Publication

The Company respectfully requests that the requirement of § 66(12)(b) of the Public Service Law and 16 NYCRR §720-8.1 for newspaper publication be waived because a customer will be notified of these tariff changes when the customer submits an application for such service with the Company.
