Rochester Gas & Electric Corporation ("RG&E" or the "Company") hereby submits for filing the following enclosed statements in compliance with its tariffs and Ordering Paragraph 3 of the New York Public Service Commission's (the "Commission") Order Authorizing Interim Adjustments to Non-Bypassable Wires Charges, Case No. 09-E-0228, issued and effective May 18, 2009 (the "Order") and Appendix 7-H (electronic tariff filing system) to the Commission's Codes, Rules and Regulations (16 NYCRR Appendix 7-H).

Effective: August 1, 2009.

Each month the Company examines the forecasted year-end difference between the NBC dollars the Company expects to collect and an updated forecast of NBC dollars. If the expected under- or over-collection exceeds \$10 million, an interim reconciliation adjustment will be applied to the NBC beginning the following month.

Customers taking service under RG&E's Fixed Price Option and ESCO Option with Supply Adjustment will not be subject to an interim reconciliation adjustment. Asset Sale Gain Account credits that the Company owes to customers will be used to mitigate the increase in NBC charges for them<sup>1</sup>.
