Attached please find Leaf Numbers 4 through 10, and 15 of PSC No. 1 – Electricity for the Village of Richmondville Electric Department (“Richmondville” or “the Village”), issued August 19, 2010 to be effective January 1, 2011.

The proposed Tariff Leaves will result in additional annual revenues of approximately \$98,923; an increase of about 8.3%. The filing is a “mini-filing” under the Commission’s Rules of Procedures and a hearing is not required.

Village of Richmondville Electric Department

The Village of Richmondville Electric Department supplies electricity to approximately 1,100 customers in the Village of Richmondville and in portions of the Town of Richmondville in Schoharie County. It is a municipal electric utility governed by a Board of Trustees consisting of four members and the mayor of the Village. The quality of service is excellent with no customer complaints and minimal outages. The electric safety record is excellent and the utility is well managed and professionally operated. The electric losses on the system are less approximately 4% which is a tribute to how well the system is maintained.

The Rate Filing

This filing provides an ample basis for the Commission to process the application expeditiously. The filing contains three years of balance sheets and income statements, as well as projections of revenues, expenses and rate base. The filing is based on fiscal year ending May 31, 2009 data. Detailed workpapers are attached supporting the rate request.

The Village's last rate increase was last year an effective date of 9/1/2008. For Fiscal Year 2009, the Village's rate of return was 0.63% (a profit of \$6,450). While the rate increase last year of \$84,790 will help reduce this loss it is not enough as labor costs have increased considerably since the last rate case. The rate increase is necessary in order to maintain the reliability and quality of service that their customers are accustomed.

In order to promote energy conservation, the Village requests that for Service Classifications No. 1 – Residential and No. 2 – General Service – Non Demand Metered, any increase in base revenues be limited to the energy charges only.

Public Notice

The Village of Richmondville Electric Department will send each customer a letter with their bills informing them of the proposed increase as well as publish a notice to the public of the proposed change once each week for four consecutive weeks in a newspaper having general circulation in their service area.
