Dear Secretary Brilling:

Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (“Con Edison” or the “Company”) is filing with the New York State Public Service Commission (the “Commission”) amendments to its Schedule for Electricity, PSC No. 10 – Electricity (“Electric Rate Schedule”), applicable to its customers in the City of New York and the County of Westchester.

The tariff leaves, which are identified below, are issued to become effective on April 1, 2012.

Background

On February 17, 2012, the Company made a tariff filing with the Commission, pursuant to the Commission’s Order issued and effective February 16, 2012, regarding “Tariff filings by Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. to replace its electric tariff schedules with electronic tariff schedules compatible with the Commission’s Electronic Tariff System” (the “Order”). As directed by the Order, the filing consisted of conforming changes that became effective on February 20, 2012. The Company also filed housekeeping changes that became effective on the same date.

Tariff Changes

The Company is making further housekeeping changes to the following leaves of the Electric Rate Schedule: Leaf 1, to correct the placement of the word “the” in reference to The Bronx, and Leaf 234 (Rider P) and Leaf 292 (Rider V), to change the first sentence of the “Applicability” section in each Rider. These initial sentences erroneously omitted Service Classification (“SC”) 15 from the list of SCs eligible for Rider service although all applicable SCs, including SC 15, were listed below the Rider name in the phrase “Applicable to SCs.”¹ With this current filing, the first sentence of “Applicability” on both Leaf 234 and Leaf 292 has been modified to indicate that it is applicable to customers taking service under “the above SCs” (i.e., the SCs that appear on the line under the Rider title) to avoid unnecessary repetition.

Conclusion and Notice

As directed by Ordering Clause 2, the leaves are issued on not less than one day’s notice, to become effective on April 1, 2012. As directed by Ordering Clause 3, the Commission has waived newspaper publication of these changes.
