Overview of the Filing

The Companies had filed proposed tariff amendments on September 26, 2011 in compliance with the Commission's Notice Establishing Filing Requirements issued and effective on August 26, 2011 in the above-referenced proceedings with subsequent revisions filed on November 7, 2011 and November 28, 2011.

After further discussion with New York Public Service Commission's Staff and representatives from the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority ("NYSERDA"), the Companies are proposing additional revisions to its tariff with an effective date of May 1, 2012. More specifically, the Companies will not apply late payment charges to unpaid loan installment amounts.

The Companies requests that the requirement of § 66(12)(b) of the Public Service Law and 16 NYCRR §720-8.1 as to newspaper publication be waived because the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority ("NYSERDA"), as the administrator of the NYSERDA loan program, will be providing outreach to customers for this program.
