Dear Secretary Brilling:

The following tariff leaves, First Revised Leaves Nos. 2, 4-18, and Original Leak No. 19 are filed on behalf of the Fairport Municipal Commission ("FMC"), in accordance with the provisions of the New York State Public Service Law and Public Service Commission's ("Commission") Regulations. The filing contains provisions and rates designed to increase the monthly bill of a residential customer using 1,330 kilowatt-hours of energy per month in the winter from \$59.66 to \$61.16 or 2.5%. The proposed increase will produce an estimated annual aggregate increase in revenues of \$475,184 based on normalized data for the twelve months ending May 31, 2010 and forecast for the year ending February 28, 2013. The instant filing is a "mini" rate case under the Commission's Rules of Procedures and a hearing is not required.

In accordance with Commission regulations and practices notice to the public will be made in a local newspaper for four (4) consecutive weeks. Also the FMC would also like to update its Factor of Adjustment at this time. The six-year average Factor of Adjustment is 1.0457 which is the method that the Commission has historically used to set the Factor of Adjustment.

The FMC oversees Fairport's own electric service, financed entirely by customers rates. Board members are appointed by the Mayor with approval of the Trustees. The FMC serves more than 14,000 customers in the Village and Perinton. The electric safety record of the FMC is excellent. The utility well managed, professionally operated and receives very few complaints.

The FMC is an efficient and successful public power community. The FMC will continue to provide safe, reliable, low cost power to its customers. Recognizing the need to use its low cost power prudently and efficiently, the FMC will continue its programs promoting energy efficiency and strategically invest in economic development.

This filing provides a sound basis for the Commission to process the application expeditiously. The instant filing is based on fiscal year 2010 data and contains three years of income statements and projections of revenues, expenses and rate base. Detailed work papers supporting the rate request will be forwarded to Commission Staff.
